

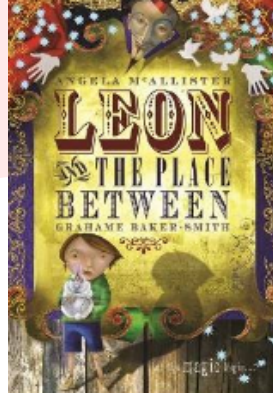

As readers, we will...

be developing our inference skills reading *Leon and the Place Between* by Angela Mcallister as well as a range of non-fiction texts. We will also continue to read a range of fiction for pleasure at school and at home.



As writers, we will...

be creating narratives and non-fiction texts based on our current reading and work in science. We will be developing more complex sentences. We will begin to join our handwriting and develop our own ability to check and correct our writing.

As mathematicians, we will...

continue to develop and apply strategies for all 4 operations with a focus on numbers to 1000. We will focus on multiplication and division, learning our 3, 4 and 8 times tables.



As scientists, we will...

we will learn that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat. We will explore and understand how humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. We will identify and classify different types of skeleton. We will also observe and compare how muscles enable a skeleton to move. We will make links with prior learning about animals including humans and develop our knowledge of food chains and nutrition for healthy growth and survival..

In computing, we will...

plan and create simple animations based on the characters we have read together as a class.
