Why is it so important to attend every day?

- Pupils with good attendance, generally achieve higher grades and enjoy learning at school more. Having a good education will help to give your child the best possible start in life.
- Learning is a progressive activity; each day's lessons build upon those of the previous day.

What can parents do to help?

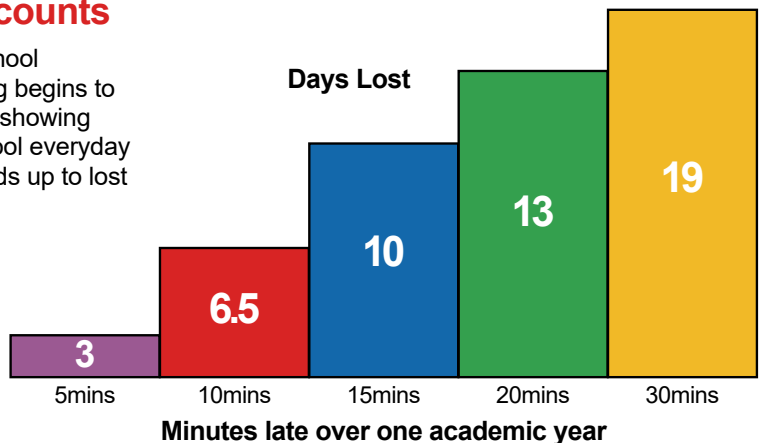
- Make sure that your child attends school regularly and arrives on time – you will establish a good routine that they will carry through their life.
- If your child starts missing school, work with the school and we will help you to improve your child's attendance. We don't have all the answers, but together we are closer to a solution.
- If your child is ill or must miss school for some other reason, contact school immediately.
- The school will not approve shopping trips, family holidays, birthday treats during school hours. Please arrange family holidays so that your child will not miss any learning.

PENALTY NOTICE: A penalty notice is a fine issued to parents or carers who fail to ensure their child attends school regularly. If your child accrues 5 school days absence or more in a twelve week rolling period, parents could be issued a penalty notice. This includes taking holidays in term time.

Penalty fines are £60.00 per child/ per parent/per week, if paid within 21 days and £120, if paid between 22 and 28 days. If the fine is not paid, parents will be reported for prosecution.

Every minute counts

Leave of absence in term time

Head teachers are no longer able to grant leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Governors have agreed that the circumstances below are seen as exceptional and authorised leave of absence will be granted for the following only:-

- Wedding of a parent
- Funeral of a close relative
- National sporting activity

Any other request which does not fall into one of the above categories will be unauthorised. An application for leave of absence must be made in advance on the appropriate form (available from the school office or from the school website in the section marked "Parents"). A leave of absence is granted entirely at the Head teacher's discretion. As stated in the most recent DFE guidance on

attendance, 'if an application for leave of absence is not made prior to the time of the required absence then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised regardless of circumstances.'

Please note that absence will not be authorised under any circumstances during any period of public examinations or internal assessments.
